

Sleeping on the earth is good. But what if some insect goes into my ear. I will become deaf. No, no. I do not want to be a farmer. I will better be a soldier.




Poet


<u>Vendor</u>

I will fly in the air with my huge plane. Clouds will float below my plane. It will be so much fun.






Auto Rickshaw Driver
